

Ohio Memory Scrapbook Assignment

Due Date: March 3, 2008

For this assignment you will create your own online scrapbook on Ohio Memory. The Ohio Memory Project is an online scrapbook of Ohio history, consisting of over 23,000 digitized images of primary sources held by archives, libraries, museums, and historical societies throughout Ohio. A presentation on Ohio Memory and how to create a scrapbook will be part of the Orientation. You can find Ohio Memory at: <http://www.ohiomemory.org>

First, choose one of the core themes:

- Frontiers and Borderlands: Native American History and the Settler Experience
- From Farm to Factory: Rural Life and the Impact of Industrialization
- Presidents and Politics: Ohio and American Political History
- Dominion of War: American Military and Technological History

Then, select **10** items about that theme for your scrapbook.

1. For **five** of these items, create a note in your scrapbook explaining why the item relates to the theme you chose.
2. For the remaining **five** items, create a note with a few ideas explaining how to use the item in the classroom to teach about that theme.

To create an online scrapbook, go to:

then:

1. Create a username and password.
2. Select your scrapbook style and font
3. Make sure that the “yes” button is activated for “*do you wish to be provided with a website address that you can give to others so that they can see your scrapbook.*”
4. Use the search and the browse functions to find items. When you have selected an item, click “*save to my scrapbook*” on the top of the item’s entry.
5. To add a note, click on “*add note*” to the right of each item.
6. To view your entire scrapbook, click on “*My Scrapbook*” at the top right of the screen.
